100% destemmed. Natural winemaking with native yeast, 3 weeks of maceration, punch downs by foot.

Notes

In 2018, Cédric decided to blend together his Cabernet Sauvignon with Cabernet Franc, and to create a single red wine, called Métisse, meaning mixed together.

About

Cedric Garreau makes tiny amounts of exceptional Loire Valley natural wine in a renovated stone building across from his home at the edge of the vineyards. All of his vineyards are certified organic, and winemaking is precise, but with a laissez-faire attitude. With old fashioned equipment, and a traditional approach, Cedric is making some of the best wines in the Loire Valley.
